Dear SBCS Parents, Students and Staff,

On January 7, 2022, The ECDOH confirmed changes that take effect immediately to guidance regarding the isolation and quarantine periods for COVID-19. As a reminder, the *isolation* period occurs when an individual tests positive for COVID-19. The *quarantine* period occurs when an individual has been identified as a close contact of a person who is positive for COVID-19.

The following changes pertain to students and staff:

If the individual is vaccinated, which includes 2 weeks post booster, and identified as a close contact:

- The individual is not required to quarantine when identified as close contact.
- The individual must monitor for symptoms and wear a well-fitting mask while around others for 10 days after the last date of exposure.
- If possible, the individual should test at day 5 with a PCR test or antigen test.
- If symptoms appear, quarantine and seek testing. In this situation, quarantine would end on the date of a negative test. If positive, isolation would occur as noted below.
- Those fully vaccinated and infected with COVID-19 within the last 90 days do not quarantine.

If the individual is (a) not fully vaccinated or (b) is fully vaccinated and is eligible for a booster, but has not yet gotten the booster, and is NOT experiencing symptoms, and is identified as a close contact:

- The individual must quarantine for 5 days.
- Individuals MUST wear a well-fitting mask for an additional 5 days and can return to school/work.

If the individual is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms OR if asymptomatic but tests positive for COVID-19 (vaccinated or unvaccinated):

- Isolation for that individual is now 5 DAYS, not the original stated 10 days.
- If asymptomatic, then at the end of 5 days or symptoms are resolving, the isolation period ends.
- Individuals MUST wear a well-fitting mask for an additional 5 days and can return to school/work.
- Individuals who cannot wear a well-fitting mask must remain in isolation for a full 10 days.
- If symptoms develop during the 5-day quarantine period, please remain in quarantine and secure a negative test in order to return to school earlier than day 10.

The iHealth Rapid Test Kit that was sent home on January 5, 2022, is for a specific purpose. The accompanying letter stated that they are for testing students against the possibility of having COVID-19. A child should be showing symptoms and/or feeling ill before a decision is made to administer. As always, this is a fluid situation as we receive updated information from the ECDOH and NYSDOH on a regular basis.
