Mesopotamia Vocabulary

Ziggurat: A rectangular pyramid with terraces built by the people in the Fertile Crescent. It was usually used as a religious temple or government building.

Irrigation Canals- Manmade streams that controlled the amount of water crops received in River Valley Civilizations.



Cuneiform: Writing system in the Mesopotamia that began around 3400 BC. Started as pictures,

that began around 3400 BC. Started as pictures, then became easy to write symbols, started writing left to right in horizontal rows.



River Valley Civilization-Either the Fertile Crescent (Mesopotamia/Tigris + Euphrates Rivers), Nile River (Egyptians), Indus River, or Huang He/Chang (ancient Chinese) civilizations. These were the first four civilizations on earth.



Silt-Loess

Nutrients gathered by running river water that were distributed onto soil to help crops grow during floods.





Economy- System of value (money, trading) connected throughout an area; includes specialization and regulation. Based on agriculture and trade.




Urban- A city area.




Monotheism-A religion that believes in one god. (Christianity, Judaism)

Civilization-Humans living in an advanced state away from chaos and nature. Civilizations have cultures, languages, cities, economies, and governments.




Currency-Coin or paper money



<u>Code of Hammurabi</u>-Legal code in Fertile Crescent (Mesopotamia) in 1800 BC. Earliest set of laws known to man.



<u>Judaism</u>-One of the first monotheistic religions, began around Mesopotamia 3,000 BC. Holdy book is called the Torah.



<u>City-State-</u>A city that is an independent nation.



Israel-Holy land to Jews that is located east of the Fertile crescent on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea.



Government-A group of people that are in power over a country, city or empire. They make laws and control wars.



Monarchy-Kings and Queens that pass power down to their children over a country, city or empire.
